

Using MySQL on Cobalt Products

1 What is MySQL

MySQL is a relational database management system that stores data in separate tables rather than putting all the data in one big place. This feature increases speed and flexibility. The tables are linked by defined relations, which enables developers to combine data from several tables on request. Structured Query Language (SQL) is the most common standardized language used to access databases.

2.2 Where to Find MySQL

Below is the location of MySQL components:

- The header files are in `/usr/include/mysql`
- The libraries are in `/usr/lib/mysql`
- The tools are in `/usr/bin`

2.3 Starting MySQL

Follow these directions to use MySQL on your Cobalt server appliance:

- 1) To start the MySQL daemon, type:

```
/etc/rc.d/init.d/mysql start
```
- 2) To connect to it with the SQL tool, type:

```
mysql
```

2.4 Halting MySQL

To halt the MySQL daemon, type:

```
/etc/rc.d/init.d/mysql stop
```

To quit MySQL, type:

```
exit
```
